WEB Site is www.UWECO.org</p> <p>The project is estimated to cost \$18MM, with \$1MM capital and \$500K for outreach from Children’s Hospital and Regional Medical Center, a \$5MM gift from the Washington Dental Service and Washington Dental Service Foundation, and a \$12MM loan from the University of Washington Internal Lending Program.</p> <p>Children’s Dental Medicine with combine with UW Pediatric Dentistry. All ambulatory Children’s dental patients will be treated at the Magnuson Park location.</p> <p>Dr. Berg explained that the recent Surgeon General’s Report on Oral Health, deemed dental caries in children was a “silent epidemic, the most common chronic illness and the #1 unmet need. It accounts for 50 million missed school hours”</p> <p>Partnership with the community of care providers is needed to solve the problem. The vision of ECOH is to be recognized throughout the world as the leader in childhood oral health, and to mitigate the unmet need in the management of childhood cares.</p> <p>ECOH is going through a “Branding Exercise” which will make it a recognizable brand</p>		
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	<p>combining research, development, education , public policy and service Dana Robinson Slote is the Community Outreach & Marketing Manager for ECOH.</p> <p>ECOH anticipates providing 40,000 patient care visits and surgical care Hopes to educate students residents, faculty, families</p> <p>Dr. Berg explained that the American Academy of Pediatrics listed the 2008 Top Three Children’s Healthcare Issues as Mental Health; Obesity, and Oral Health – interesting in that this is a “Medical” organization. In a way this opens the door to collaboration between the medical and dental communities in addressing children’s oral health.</p>
